CIVIL AIR PATROL UNIFORM MANUAL

CAPM 39-1, 25 March 2005, is supplemented as follows:

Table 1-3, item 3.

1. A shoulder cord will be worn by members of the West Virginia Wing Cadet Drill Team. The shoulder cord will be blue and gold. The shoulder cord will be presented to the active members of the cadet competition team following the Middle East Region Cadet Competition, at such time and place as the Wing Commander may direct. The shoulder cord may be worn by the team members performing the duty for which the use of the shoulder cord was authorized until 1 October of the following year. The shoulder cord must be returned to the Wing Director of Cadet Program at that time or whenever the cadet to whom it is issued ceases to be an active member of the team. The unit commander of each team member is responsible to see that the shoulder cord is returned to wing headquarters. The shoulder cord is to be worn on the left shoulder of the blue uniform only. The individual to whom the shoulder cord is issued is responsible for keeping it clean and in good repair, and for replacing it if lost or destroyed.

2. A shoulder cord will be worn by members of the West Virginia Wing Cadet Color Guard Team. The shoulder cord will be blue and silver. The shoulder cord will be presented to the active members of the color guard team following the Middle East Region Cadet Competition, at such time and place as the Wing Commander may direct. The shoulder cord may be worn by the team members performing the duty for which the use of the shoulder cord was authorized until 1 October of the following year. The shoulder cord must be returned to the Wing Director of Cadet Program at that time or whenever the cadet to whom it is issued ceases to be an active member of the team. The unit commander of each team member is responsible to see that the shoulder cord is returned to wing headquarters. The shoulder cord is to be worn on the left shoulder of the blue uniform only. The individual to whom the shoulder cord is issued is responsible for keeping it clean and in good repair, and for replacing it if lost or destroyed.

Table 2-3, item 1

1. The West Virginia Wing shoulder patch will be worn, centered ½" below the shoulder seam, on the left sleeve of the BDU uniform shirt. The wing patch should also be worn on the BDU field jacket, but is not required.

Table 2-3, item 6

1. Members of a WV Wing Emergency Services Ground Team are authorized to wear a blaze orange baseball cap, imprinted with either the name of the West Virginia Wing or their unit name, with the BDU uniform. The blaze orange cap will only be worn during practice or actual E. S. missions, or while serving at special events/activities, when authorized by the Wing Commander.

Table 4-6, item 1

1. The West Virginia Wing shoulder patch will be worn, centered ½” below the shoulder seam, on the left sleeve of the CAP dark blue utility uniform.

Table 6-2, item 7

1. Requirements for award of the Emergency Services Patch:

- a. Hold a valid Emergency Services Qualification Card (CAPF 101) issued by proper authority and accompanied by a current CAP membership card.
- b. Be Qualified and Current in GES and one other ES specialty.

2. Procedures for awarding the Emergency Services Patch:

- a. The applicant must submit a completed CAP Form 2a, Request for and Approval of Personnel Actions, to the Unit Commander, requesting the award of the Emergency Services Patch.
- b. The Unit Commander will verify that the applicant has fulfilled the requirements before approving the award of the Emergency Services Patch.
- c. The unit will forward a copy of each award of Emergency Services Patch (CAPF 2a) to the Wing Director of Emergency Services.

3. Authority to wear an Emergency Services Patch:

- a. CAP members awarded the Emergency Services Patch by proper authority may continue to wear the patch only as long as CAP membership is maintained and the member holds a valid Emergency Services Qualification Card (CAPF 101), with at least two current qualifications.
